What is Pupil Premium?

- Introduced in 2011 to improve the education of underprivileged children.
- Extra funding so that we can provide additional support for children who are faced with additional challenges.
- Objective To help schools unlock the learning potential of their pupils and provide them with a better education
- Aim to narrow the gap in educational development between children of underprivileged backgrounds and their peers.

Who is eligible?

- All those receiving one or more of the following benefits:
- Income support
- Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income-based Employment and Support Allowance
- Support as a result of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit
- Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit (If a household is earning less than £7,400 per year.)

Uniform

School colours are maroon and grey

- All children to have white polo shirts with or without the school logo on. School shirts are to have a collar.

- We are only able to administer medication if it has been prescribed by the doctor and the correct forms are filled in at the office.

- All absences will be record on your child's end of year report and a termly letter will be sent out to those children who are at 95-90% by their class teacher and 90% or below by Mrs Atkins.
